






by Parr, Todd




With his signature blend of playfulness and sensitivity, Todd Parr explores the important, timely subject of environmental protection and conservation in this eco-friendly picture book.

A beautifully simple book for small children where transforming pages reveal ten things that everyone can do to help conserve their world.





by Gliori, Debi


When dragons cut down too many trees, blow out too much hot air, and do other environmental damage, the future looks grim, but other animals advise them on how to mend their ways and save the planet.

by Middleton, Charlotte






Every day is Earth Day


The Lorax
